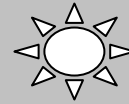

**Bull Market
Food Policy**



Welcome to the USF Bull Market! Listed below are the policies and procedures for Groups that wish to bring food to the Bull Market.

Please read the entire packet as your question may already be answered herein. If your question is not covered, please contact the Bull Market Staff via phone (813-974-5309) or email (bullmarket@admin.usf.edu). Allow at least one week for response.

Rules for Bringing Food to the Bull Market

1. All foods brought to the Bull Market must comply with the Hillsborough County Department of Health regulations.
2. All groups that wish to bring food to the Bull Market must have said food approved *one week before* attending the Bull Market.
 - Groups that do not notify the Market of their intent to bring food *and* obtain permission will be penalized.
3. Student Organizations and Departments are the only groups permitted to sell food at the Market as per the Bull Market Rules and Regulations.
4. Vendors and Not-For-Profit (hereafter referred to as NPOs) organizations are only permitted to give out food/samples
 - Food items must comply with the Bull Market Food Policy
 - The Vendor/NPO may not bring food items onto the Market Site without first obtaining permission from the Bull Market Staff.
 - Please allow at least one week to process food requests
5. Restaurants that wish to advertise on the Bull Market may bring samples of their product provided that they:
 - Present the Market Staff with a photocopy of their Florida Department of Restaurants and Hotels issued permit during registration.
 - Vendors who do not representing restaurants, but still deal in foods, must submit state licenses from either the Department of Restaurants and Hotels or Department of Agriculture, where applicable.
 - Foods permitted to be brought onto the Market must be prepared under proper conditions as outlined by the Department of Health.
6. Foods must be prepackaged and individually wrapped.

7. Groups that wish to bring foods not permitted under usual circumstances (see below) may only do so if their intent is to consume the food themselves. (i.e., if a representative wishes to cook fried chicken for their own lunch or bake cookies to share with the other people staffing his/her group's table).

1. ** Vendor Prepared Only. Must get Market Manager's permission before bringing said items to the Market.
 - Reservation must be done at least two weeks in advance, no exceptions.
2. **+ Vendor Prepared Only. Requires Market Manager's permission.
 - Reservation must be done at least one week in advance.
3. *+ Vendor Prepared, but does not require Market Manager's permission provided that the food comes from an approved vendor.
 - Groups are still required to report that they intend to bring said items as part of their bake sale.
 - Reservation must be done at least one week in advance.
4. Baked goods must be store brought. Foods prepared at home are prohibited.
5. Groups selling pizza, donuts, or uncut cakes/brownies must wear gloves when handling food.
 - When selling cookies or cupcakes, if possible, ask the bakery to prepackage the items based on the unit of resale intended (i.e. if intending to sell four cookies for \$0.25, request that the bakery wrap the cookies in bunches of four).

6. Foods that require a microwave, freezer, hotplate, or stove for preparation/storing will not be permitted onto the Market without a two week notice and permission from the Market Manager. This includes, but is not limited to: hot pockets and other meat pastries, ice cream, popsicles, snow cones, slushies, and hot beverages (see below).

Beverage List

Only the following beverages may be sold or distributed at the USF Bull Market as per University of South Florida's Department of Auxiliary Services regulations.

12oz. Cans: Coke, Coke Zero, Coke with Lime, C-2, Caffeine Free Coke, Vanilla Coke, Diet Vanilla Coke, Diet Coke, Diet Coke w/ lime, Caffeine Free Diet Coke, Cherry Coke, Diet Cherry Coke, Sprite, Sprite Zero, Fresca, Barq's Rootbeer, Pibb Xtra, Nestea Cool, Mello Yello, Mello Yello Cherry, Minute Maid Lemonade, Light, Seagram's Ginger Ale, Fanta Grape, Fanta Orange.

20oz. Carbonated

Beverages: Coke, Coke Zero, Coke with Lime, C-2, Caffeine Free Coke, Diet Coke, Diet Coke w/ lime, Caffeine Free Diet Coke, Cherry Coke, Diet Cherry Coke, Vanilla

Coke, Diet Vanilla Coke, Sprite, Sprite Re-Mix, Sprite Zero, Barq's Rootbeer, Pibb Xtra, Nestea Cool, Mello Yello, Mello Yello Cherry, Seagram's Ginger Ale, Fanta Orange, Fanta Grape, Fanta Strawberry.

20oz. Minute Maid

Beverages: Minute Maid Lemonade, Minute Maid Pink Lemonade, Minute Maid Fruit Punch, Minute Maid Strawberry, Tropical Citrus, Raspberry Lemonade.

Water: Evian, Dasani, Dasani with Raspberry, Dasani with Lemon, Dasani with Strawberry.

Energy Drinks: Full-Throttle, Rock Star, Diet Rock Star, Von Dutch.

Nestea 20oz. Bottles:

Nestea Ice, Nestea Green, Nestea Diet w/ Splenda.

15.2oz. Minute Maid

Juices: 100% Orange, Apple, Ruby Red Grapefruit, Cranberry/Apple/Raspberry, Crangrape.

20oz. Powerade:

POWERaDE Mountain Blast, POWERaDE Lemon Lime, POWERaDE Fruit Punch, POWERaDE Orange, POWERaDE Blk Cherry, POWERaDE Lemon, POWERaDE Strawberry.

1. The sale of Pepsi products, Gatorade, and/or bottled water other than Dasani is prohibited.
2. Groups wishing to sell hot coffee or tea must first gain permission from the Market Staff.
3. Beverages not listed above, but still considered Coca-Cola products (such as foreign soda or iced coffee) are permitted, provided that the group can prove that the beverage is a Coca-Cola product.
